CONCRETE SHIP HAS TRIAL.

The Faith Passes Successful Test in Pacific Waters.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 5.—The 7,900-ton steamer Faith, the largest concrete ship in the world, built by the San Francisco Shipbuilding Company, had a successful trial trip here today, averaging more than eleven knots an honr in its four trips over the official trial course.

The Faith's engines were installed in forty-four days, it being a local record. The success of the trip will result in the construction of three more concrete boats, each larger than the Faith, at Redwood City by the same company.
